



Parents and carers should complete a consent form for children participating in workshops in order to comply with Health and Safety regulations. Forms are available from the Box Office and should be returned on the day of the workshop.

AGE GUIDE*

Performances at the Festival are created especially for children and young people between the ages of 3 and 14. The age shown against each performance has been carefully defined by the performing company to help with the choice of appropriate show(s). Every child must have a ticket. However, accompanying siblings of 2 and under are welcome to sit on adult companions laps at the performances marked with a star at no charge if accompanying another child of 3+.

FINDING THE FESTIVAL

The Festival takes place in Inverleith Park in the north of the city. The entrance is on Arboretum Road opposite the Royal Botanical Garden.
